Happy April! April is Earth Month. For environmental groups like Ventura Audubon, it is the busiest month of the year. We have three big events this month; on Friday April 7th we will be at Patagonia's flagship store at 235 W Santa Clara Street, Ventura from 2 to 4 pm. Come on by and learn about our shorebird recovery program, Dog Rangers and ways to volunteer for the chapter.

On April 22nd we will be conducting our first Beach Naturalist Workshop of the year. This time it will include a 2-hour classroom training followed by 2 hours of field work at Ormond Beach. The class will be held at Oxnard College, for more information or to sign up please contact outreach@venturaaudubon.org. You can also sign up through our [website](#).

Our final event of April is the important "Raise the Roost" party and silent auction benefitting the VAS shorebird recovery program. This year we have NEW shorebird recovery commemorative pint glasses. For \$10, you'll get a glass and a fill. The silent auction has items including wine tastings, gift cards and jewelry. Bidding opens on April 28th. Please keep an eye for the email in your inbox.

Earth month is also a reminder that the fight is not over. As your advocate for birds and their habitat, we are constantly monitoring decisions that effect our local environment. Two issues that are on our radar are the Santa Clara River Estuary (SCRE), the settling ponds at the waste water treatment plant and Ormond Beach.

The SCRE is an important habitat for many bird species in our area. It is recognized as a globally Important Bird Area (IBA) and it serves as an important stopover on the Pacific Flyway. The SCRE and adjacent settling ponds are enabled by the wastewater treatment plant. The City of Ventura plans on diverting the majority of the discharge from this plant to recharge our water supply. This is an important step in maintaining our water supply in years of drought; however, it would drastically reduce or even eliminate the SCRE wetlands. We believe that with proper planning we can preserve this important bird habitat and meet our water needs. There is a California Coastal Commission meeting on April 14th to discuss this issue. On April 24 from 6 - 8pm there will be a town hall meeting to discuss the Ormond Beach Restoration Access Project. This is a significant project to ensure the long-term health

and protection of Ormond Beach. See the flyer below and plan on supporting the future of Ormond Beach.

Shorebird Recovery Program Fundraiser: April 29th 2023

Are you ready to "Raise the Roost" for shorebirds?

Ventura County has two nesting beaches that do not have land owners able to run a management program for nesting western snowy plovers and least terns. These beaches are Hollywood and Ormond Beaches. Ventura Audubon has taken on this responsibility, so we conduct a nest monitoring, habitat protection and public outreach program.

Our spring fundraiser is a critical source of funding for the year. We need community support to continue this program.



Why support Raise the Roost?

Funding is needed for nesting season on Ormond and Hollywood Beaches, which has just begun and continues through September. It will support nest monitoring, allow us to purchase materials for habitat protection including fencing, signage, trail cameras, plus supplies for volunteers in our community stewardship program, the Beach Naturalists.

"THE PIPING PLOVERS OF NEW YORK CITY, A TINY ENDANGERED SHOREBIRD INSPIRES A MOVEMENT"

Speaker: Chris Allieri

Program Description:

This is the story of a tiny, intrepid endangered shorebird nesting along the busiest beaches of our biggest city, and how an army of volunteers have come together to protect them. From sea-level rise and

strong storms, to human-commensal predation and nest vandalism, the odds are stacked against Piping Plovers in Queens, New York City. With that, NYC Plover Project keeps going, just like the Plovers.

Listen to why the Piping Plovers of the Rockaways may be a tale of hope, resilience, and strength amidst the challenging backdrop for urban wildlife. From the halls of Congress to wintering grounds in the Bahamas, photos and stories will be shared of the Piping Plovers and all that is being done to protect them.



Speaker Bio:

Chris Allieri is the founder of NYC Plover Project, a non-profit organization he began in March 2021 upon seeing a need to protect endangered Piping Plovers in New York City who were otherwise left to fend for themselves. In two years, the organization has grown to a force nearly 200 volunteers who have performed more than 10,000 volunteer hours protecting nesting plovers and their chicks on the busiest beaches in the city.

NYC Plover Project was awarded the 2021 Hartzog Award as the non-profit volunteer group of the year for the entire National Park Service, with whom they have a partnership. Chris is also founder of Mulberry & Astor, a communications firm focused on climate tech startups. A long-time resident of NYC, Chris grew up on the beaches of southern New Jersey where he first saw a Piping Plover at a young age with his late father, Carl.
